Folklore Day, a celebration of the arts, will be Saturday at MainStrasse Village in Covington.

The event, sponsored by MainStrasse Village Association and the Covington Carnegie Arts Center, will feature artisans representing the visual and performing arts from noon to 5 p.m.

Eight artists will set up mini-galleries at various courtyards, and folklore singers will perform at the restaurants. Craftsmen will be demonstrating in the shops.

Covington Carriage will offer a carriage shuttle from the Goose Girl Fountain to the Covington Carnegie Arts Center, where Kentucky's Water Color Society will present Aqueous '85 Traveling Exhibition. Other galleries house the painting and drawing of Miriam Misenko and the sculpture of Michael McAuley, Jeffrey Rutledge and Alfred Major. The shuttle cost is \$1 per person.

"Kim Cummins and the Floppets" will present a puppet show at 1, 2:15, 3:15 and 4:15 p.m. at the Carroll Chimes Bell Tower on Philadelphia. A keepers lecture by the Cincinnati Zoo begins at 3 p.m. at the Goose Girl Fountain.

Box lunches will be available at Haegele's Gast Haus Zur Linde, the Strauss Haus and the New Main Tavern. Kids Helping Kids will man a refreshment booth on Sixth Street as a fund-raiser for the organization.

Folk music will be performed at the Goose Girl Fountain at 5:30 p.m. Seating will be available.

Admission to Folklore Day is free. Parking is available at the Fifth Street Center lot. MainStrasse is off Interstate 75, Fifth Street exit in Covington. For more information, call (606) 491-0458.
