The ninth annual Northern Kentucky University Lincoln Award will go to Judith Gibbons of Lakeside Park, John W. "Jack" Steinman of Fort Thomas and George Schaefer Jr. of Cincinnati.

The winners, announced Friday, will be presented April 18 at the Clarion Hotel Riverview in Covington. The award was established in 1992 to honor people who have a strong, positive influence on the community through their professional and personal commitments and achievements. Mrs. Gibbons is vice president for community affairs for Lee Hecht Harrison, a career management firm in Cincinnati and Covington, and previously was vice president of finance.

She is vice chair of the Northern Kentucky Chamber of Commerce. Her other activities include membership on the boards of the Northern Kentucky Symphony and the Education Alliance of Northern Kentucky. Steinman is chairman of the board of Deluxe Engraving in Cincinnati. He is former president of Greater Cincinnati Kids Helping Kids and a founder and first president of the Fort Thomas Library, which is now part of Campbell County Public Library. Schaefer was named president and CEO of Fifth Third Bancorp in 1990. He is a West Point graduate with degrees in engineering and business. His board memberships include the University of Cincinnati and the Kenton County Airport Board.

Runners can test their skills while helping kids with drug and alcohol problems by entering the Chiquita Brands River Hop 8 on Sunday.

The 5K and 10K races and fitness walk begin at 8 a.m. at the Northern Kentucky Convention Center, 1 RiverCenter Blvd., Covington. Both races take runners across the Ohio River to Cincinnati, then back into Kentucky. Entry fee is \$20 the day of the race.

The morning will include refreshments, music and information booths both before and after the event.

Proceeds benefit Kids Helping Kids, a long-term rehabilitation program for adolescents with drug and alcohol problems. Located in Milford, Ohio, it serves children from Indiana, Ohio and Kentucky. The nonprofit organization must raise more than \$200,000 annually to make up the difference between the participants' fees and actual treatment costs.

Those who don't want to run but want to help can do so by sponsoring a participating runner or walker.
