

## YOUTH PROGRAMS TO GET \$345,000

The Columbus Foundation has committed \$345,000 in 1986 to six programs to promote recreation and employment opportunities for youth and to respond to the problems of drug abuse and juvenile delinquency.

Boys Clubs of Columbus will receive \$100,000 toward a \$1 million renovation of its Gift Street center, which serves 1,000 Columbus children.

Action for Children will receive \$45,000 to develop before- and after- school care programs for school-age children who would otherwise be left alone at home.

The Central Ohio Friends of Kids Helping Kids will receive \$60,000 for a long-term adolescent alcohol and drug treatment program to help a minimum of 60 youths and their families during the first year of the program.

The Columbus Urban League will receive \$40,000 for the year-round support of the Business Jobs for Youth Program, in which more than 740 youths found summer jobs in 1985.

Project Passage, Inc. will receive \$20,000 for a juvenile delinquency prevention project for two Columbus Public Schools.

Another \$80,000 has been set aside for a youth outreach program to be coordinated by local governments and youth service agencies.
