

Democrats Sound Call For Unity

DADE CITY — More than 400 Pasco County Democrats heard a call for party unity as well as comments on the Watergate affair at "an old-fashioned Democratic get-together" Saturday at the Pasco County fairgrounds.

Commissioner Doyle Conner of the Florida Department of

Agriculture and Consumer Services said gatherings such as this are ideal "to build the unity of our party in anticipation of next year's elections."

Pasco Circuit Court Clerk V. **Miller Newton** said Watergate will open up new opportunities for votes for Democratic candidates.

In a lighter moment, Pasco County Commissioner Henry

Strauber said he has been accused of voting with the Republicans on the County Commission. Noting that the four other commissioners are Republicans, he said: "If I expect to get anything done, I have no choice but to vote with the Republicans."

Other speakers were State Sens. Alan Trask and Curtis Peterson, National Commit-

teeman Norman Bie, County Democratic Chairman Daniel Boyko, Pasco County School Supt. Raymond Stewart, Pasco Elections Supervisor Mary Morgan and Sheriff Basil Galnes.

Ann Cramer, vice chairman of the Florida Democratic Executive Committee, swore in officers and directors of the newly chartered Dade City

Area Democratic Club.

The officers are Tim Baldwin, president; Cleon Edensfield, vice president and Edna Garren, secretary-treasurer.

Directors are Dave Schneider, E. J. Nolen, Joe Hermann and Mary Morgan.

An appeal was made at the meeting for support of the party's Sept. 15 national telethon on NBC.
