## Pasco Commission Will Meet Today

DADE CITY — The Pasco County Commission will meet in special session at 10 a.m. today at the Pasco County courthouse to wrap up its 1972-73 fiscal year.

Clerk of the Circuit Court Miller Newton asked last week for the special meeting so the commission can approve budget transfers and pay off as many bills as possi-ble under its 72-73 budget.

The 1972-73 fiscal year ended Sept. 30, but state auditing procedures allow a 30-day grace period to complete as many transactions as possible.

Also up for commission consideration today is an agreement setting policies and procedures for a computerized data processing center to be shared by several county government agencies, the Pasco County School Board and the Pasco-Hernando Community College Board.

The agreement was signed Friday by Newton, Supervisor of Elections Mary E. Morgan, Tax Collector Maxine Coulter and Tax Assessor Ted Williams. It still awaits signatures from County Administrator George Knoblock, Sheriff Basil Gaines and representatives of the County Commission, School Board and college board.
