PASCO COUNTY

In the Republican County Commission race, Sam Heller led incumbent commission Chairman Walter Voorhees 1,170-1,058, with Dr. Frank Bolander seven votes behind.

Robert K. Rees led the District 4 Democratic primary with 2,440 votes, trailed by Joseph Tubolino with 895 and Frank Janczlic with 558.

Incumbent School Board Chairman Leon Milton trailed Agnes Deals 2,119 - 1,542. Circuit Clerk Miller Newton led Ero Waino 2,971 - 687.

K. M. "Mike" Olson led the voting in the District 3 County Commission race with 1,880 votes, compared to 802 for Robert "Bob" Davis, 661 for Lana Mathews, 481 for Vinton Heirfield and 361 for A. R. "Dick" Ancl.

Incumbent, School Board Chairman Leon Milton trailed his opponent Agnes Deals, a Dade City housewife, 2,119 to 1,542 in the Democratic primary. The outcome will determine the election because neither faces Republican opposition.

Circuit Clerk Miller Newton appeared certain to receive the Democratic nomination in his reelection bid. He led his opponent, Ero Wainio, 2,971 to 687.

In the District 3 County Commission race, Democratic primary, New Port Richey

banker K. M. "Mike" Olson led a field of five candidates with 1,880 votes, more than double the nearest tally rolled up by Robert "Bob" Davis' 802. Lana Mathews had 661 trailed by Vinton Heirfield's 481 and A. R. "Dick" Ancl's 361.

The District 3 primary appeared to be heading toward a runoff. The winner of that runoff will have no Republican opposition in the general election.

In hotly contested Republican party races, former Pinellas County Republican Jack P. Insko trailed New Port Richey real estate salesman C. John Brasher, 1,186 to 1,222. Mike Snyder was third with 595.

In the Republican state committeewoman race Clare Barnard led New Port Richey council member Nan Lefila 1,608 to 1,154.

Returns were coming in very slowly Tuesday night in Pasco County and voter turnout appeared light.

In the County Commission District 4 race Walter Steed Jr. has a slight advantage, with four precincts counted, over John S. Crowder. It would appear that Crowder and Steed will face each other in a runoff. Ralph Bedford is running third.
