No election complaints filed officially: Newton

NEW PORT RICHEY — Circuit Clerk Miller Newton said no official letter citing violations of election lays in last week's Pasco County primary balloting had been filed in his office as of Monday afternoon.

Ron Mathews, 23 Marshfield Drive, Holiday, filed oral complaints with Newton Thursday, and said he would file a certified letter outlining the alleged violations the next day.

Mathews, is the husband of Lana Mathews, unsuccessful candidate for the Democratic nomination for the County Commission District 3 seat.

His oral complaints included candidates handing out literature too close to the polling places, persons inside voting places telling people whom to vote for, election officials not maintaining proper posts and malfunctioning machines.
