Commission fires Cashion on second vote; charging vendetta, he says he'll fight it

NEW PORT RICHEY — By a 5-0 vote, the Passo County Commission Tuesday fired Acting County Administrator and Building Department Director John W. Cashion. Commission Chairman Mike Olson cited lack of confidence in Cashion and Cashion's reapplication last week for the job of fulltime administrator. Olson said he does not believe that it would be fair to the incoming administrator to have a man on his staff who has been a competitor for the job.

new administrator assumes his duties about June 1.

Assistant Building Director Sherman Williams will head the building department until the new administrator decides on a permanent successor.

CASHION HAS BEEN acting administrator for more than five months, and building director since October 1973. He said he plans first to go to Pasco-Pinellas State Atty. James T. Russell with charges of malfeasance and misfea-

Newton said Cashion's charge came as a complete sur-prise to him. "I'm just the clerk to the board," Newton said, "I don't know what I have to do with all this (the action taken by the commission Tuesday.)"
