Four candidates seek San Antonio city commission seats

SAN ANTONIO

Four candidates will vie Tuesday for three seats on the San Antonio City Commission. Two incumbents, one relative newcomer and a former city councilman will be in the running.

Incumbents Eugene Hester and Francis Blommell will be seeking re-election to their commission seats. A third incumbent, commission chairman and Mayor C. B. McCabe, will not seek re-election.

Vying for an opportunity for McCabe's seat — or to unseat either Hester or Blommell, will be Mike Allesandro, a former candidate who was defeated in the last city election, and Malin K. Marsh, who was mayor of San Antonio 1950 and 51, and who served 10 years on the City Council before retiring temporarily in 1961.

Alessandro, 29, was born in New York City, and attended schools in Piedmont, Calif. A veteran of four years in the U.S. Air Force, he is a 1974 graduate of St. Leo College. He also worked as a San Antonio police officer for nine months before going to work in the office of Circuit Court Clerk **Miller Newton** where he is assistant director of law and records.
