



Saunders In

MIAMI (AP) Democrats JoAnn Saunders and Charlie Friedman and Republican Bob Johnson, all involved in bitter congressional campaigns, were nominated Tuesday in Florida's runoff primary.

With 264 of 286 precincts reporting in Central Florida's 5th District, Mrs. Saunders had 58 per cent of the vote to 42 per cent for Miller Newton. Mrs. Saunders faces Freshman Rep. Richard Kelly, who narrowly defeated her in 1974.

In the 8th District, Johnson, a state representative from Sarasota, had 57 per cent of the vote to 43 per cent for Joe Lovingood, a former Sarasota County planning commissioner. Some 193 of 207 precincts had reported. Johnson meets Democratic Banker Andrew Ireland.

And with all 250 precincts reporting in the 12th District, Friedman, a Hollywood dentist who lost the 1974 general election to Republican Rep. J. Herbert Burke, had 53 per cent to 47 per cent for Anne Kolb, a Broward County commissioner.
