returns, edged ahead to capture the nomination with 2,293 votes against Alsobrook's 2,044. Wing scored heavily in South Wildwood, South Bushnell and Center Hill.

For property appraiser Ronnie Hawkins outscored his challenger E. J. (Jim) Jenkins in virtually every precinct, running up a total of 2,334 votes to Jenkins' 1,878, Both Wing and Hawkins will be unopposed in the general election.

At the state level, JoAnn Saunders, standing for Fifth District Congressional Representative, easily eclipsed Miller Newton with 2,944 votes to Newton's 1,186.

For Justice of the State Supreme Court, Fredrick B. Karl, with 1,84l votes, almost doubled Charles R. Holley's tally of 937.

A jubilant Lois Kinard, county supervisor of elections, announced the turnout in Sumter added up to 50.5 per cent of the registered voters. She thinks this may put the county in the running for best in the state.
