Democratic candidates form united front to unseat Kelly

HIS COMMENTS, made Wednesday night during a panel discussion at a forum sponsored by the Pasco County Young Democrata, were obviously aimed at the problems suffered by the Democrata who opposed Kelly two years

Joann Saunders, an Orlando businesswoman, won the Democratic nomination. But her victory was clouded during a series of ethics commission complaints filed by Miller Nestan, a former Pasco circuit clerk who lost the primary. Mrs. Saunders lost to Kelly in the general election.

Olson and Hernando County Commissioner Adrian Bell appeared at the meeting, one of first of many forums scheduled between now and the September primary. Orlando lawyer David Best and State Rep. Donald Poindester of St. Peterburg, who also are seeking the Democratic nomination, did not attend.

"I promise you I'll bring back the same wife I take to Washington," Olson said in a reference to Kelly's recent di-vorce from his wife Loraine.

OLSON SAID HE sees inflation as the major issue in this year's election campaign. He ranked the nation's ener-gy needs second.

OLSON SAID HE favors the Equal Rights Amendment and believes that right-to-work laws should be left to the individual states because of differing needs between the southern states and the northern industrial states. Offering a study in contrast, Bell, an ultre-conservative said he is opposed to abortion, the Equal Rights Amendment, gun control and relations with Cubs.

He said he favors production of the neutren bomb, B-1

commor and the cruise missile; covert intelligence of tions; a constitutional amendment to restore pray achools and a tax credit for parents of college and p achool students.

BELL SAID HE believes that the "plight of the average man" is the major campaign issue this year. He expressed concern over deficit spending, the balance of trade, a growing disrespect for God and the Christian way of life. He said he is alarmed by the damage caused by 11.8. Supreme Court rulings that have banned prayer in schools and destroyed the "moral fiber" of people.

"I'm strongly against abortion and support the right-to-life amendment that would prohibit the slaughter of unborn on the altar of convenience," Bell said.

Bell said he believes that the United States should be cautious in its negotiations with the Soviets because he does not believe that they can be trusted.
