The Hoppers Auto Club teaches auto maintenance and, through special club projects, promotes highway safety.

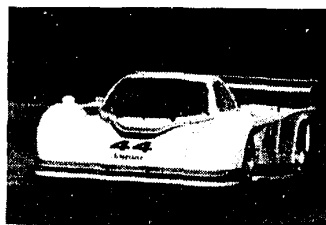
Adult Tennis Lessons
